The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

- In the year of 2007-08 the college decided to prepare for reaccreditation and peer team visit.
- During the current year, the college is reaccredited at 'A' grade with CGPA of 3.28 on four point scale by NAAC.
- The plan of action for quality enhancement for the year 2008-09 and outcome are as follow:
- The following PG courses have been incepted in the college M.A. II (Geography), M.Sc. II (Organic Chemistry).
- The college has a very vital share in Research, Publication, Sports and Educational tours.
- The experienced teachers of the college have guided Seven M. Phil. and 2 Ph.D. scholars.
- Two teachers have completed 2 minor research projects and 6 projects (7 teachers) are ongoing.
- Twelve books have been co-authored by 6 teachers.
- Thirteen research papers are published in international and national level journals and proceedings.
- Seven teachers presented 6 papers at international and national level, two teachers presented 1 paper at state level academic forums.
- Three University Level Workshops were organized on various themes.
- Two teachers participated in faculty Development programs
- Ninety eight students have been benefited through 3 study tours.
- Eight students were selected in 5 different sports events at inter-university level.
- The College won General Champion trophy in *Yuvarang*.
- At university level the college was winner in 3 sports events and runner in 2 events.

The college activities are designed to achieve these goals and objectives effectively, as under:

1. To impart quality higher education:

The college offers a wide and novel range of programmes. Teachers continuously practice learner-centered and innovative teaching strategies like seminars, group discussions, role play, surprise tests, PPT presentations etc. Facilities like ICT, internet, CAL; enriched library, well-equipped laboratories, rich academic ambience etc., are accessible in order to make effective teaching-learning process and quality higher education in every walk of life.

2. To develop responsible and sensitive youth having social commitment:

A wide range of extra-curricular and extension activities such as NSS, NCC are practiced on a larger scale. Such activities help built moral, confidante as well as sound characters.

3. To promote research - The college is a recognized research center/ facility for all the streams in Arts, Science and Commerce. Teachers and students are motivated to undertake minor/ major research project particularly related to the delicate problems of the society. Research is incorporated among students from their bachelor's degree.

4. To broaden the vision of the youth:

Teachers try to make the students aware and responsive about development in different walks of life at National and Global scenario. Emphasis is given on improving global competency among the students. Training programmes, seminars, group discussions, educational tours, interaction with society etc. are targeted to bring global competency among the students.
